Question: Do you happen to remember what the Bielt sign is, and in what disease is it sometimes detected?

Answer: The Bielt sign consists of a collarette of scales around the individual lesions of secondary syphilis.^{1,2} Such a clinical finding can be noted, of course, in a number of diseases with pink annular lesions including such as commonly diagnosed conditions as pityriasis rosea tinea corporis, and erythema annulare centrifugum amongst others.³
